


# \ Made with just two 1.5m rolls of Tatami-Beri! / ● How to make a mini tote bag


**Caution!** • No ironing • No washing  
Making time: About 50 minutes  
Materials: Tatami-Beri 1.5m x 2

\* Use polyester sewing thread #60, sewing machine needle no. 11, and needle no. 14 for points with many overlaps.  
\* Backstitch at each point where each seam starts and ends.


① Cut Tatami-Beri as shown in the illustration below. \* Cut this way so you can get all the parts you need.




② Place one main body piece on top of another with their right sides facing inward, and sew keeping along a seam space of 0.7cm from the edge. In the same way, sew the four pieces together and open the left and right sides out. (No ironing)




③ Fold the main body piece in ② inside out, and sew 1cm from one edge. Do the same for the other edge.




④ Fold one handle by laying out and matching both edges at the center, and then fold it in half so that the width is about 2cm. Sew 0.3cm from both edges. Do the same for the other handle.




⑤ Turn the main body piece over and open the left and right sides at both ends on the back side of the main body piece. Temporarily tack down one handle at a position 0.5cm from the top. Do the same for the other handle.




⑥ Fold one end of the facing 1cm, and sew 0.3cm from the edge.



⑦ Lap the facing over the opening of the main body piece (\* so that the sewn side in ⑥ is on the lower side), and sew around 1cm from the top of the opening.



⑧ Put the facing inside the main body piece, and firmly fold the opening. Sew around 0.3cm from the top to finish sewing.



Finished size: About 22cm (not including handles) in length x about 25cm in width
